

- 1 At the end of title XI, add the following:
- 2 SRI LANKA
- 3 Sec. 1121. (a) The Secretary of the Treasury shall
- 4 instruct the United States Executive Directors of the
- 5 international financial institutions (as defined in section
- 6 1701(c)(2) of the International Financial Institutions Act
- 7 (22 U.S.C. 262r(c)(2))) to vote against any loan, agree-
- 8 ment, or other financial support for Sri Lanka, except for

- 1 basic human needs, unless the Secretary of State certifies
- 2 to the Committees on Appropriations that the Government
- 3 of Sri Lanka is respecting the rights of internally dis-
- 4 placed persons, accounting for persons detained in the
- 5 conflict, providing access to affected areas and populations
- 6 by humanitarian organizations and the media, and imple-
- 7 menting policies to promote reconciliation and justice, in-
- 8 cluding devolution of power to local bodies as provided for
- 9 in the Constitution of Sri Lanka.
- 10 (b) The requirement under subsection (a) shall not
- 11 apply to balance of payments support to the Central Bank
- 12 of Sri Lanka if the Secretary of the Treasury certifies to
- 13 the Committees on Appropriations that such payments are
- 14 necessary to prevent significant and imminent hardship
- 15 among the general population of Sri Lanka.
- 16 (c) Not later than 90 days after the date of the enact-
- 17 ment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit a
- 18 report to the Committees on Appropriations detailing inci-
- 19 dents during the conflict in Sri Lanka that may constitute
- 20 violations of international humanitarian law or crimes
- 21 against humanity, and, to the extent practicable, identi-
- 22 fying the parties responsible.
